Very early in my tenure here in Ocala, a dear friend of the symphony, Bob Reilly, helped coin our unofficial motto: "Your Orchestra, Your Music." Over the years—and especially now, as we embark on the Ocala Symphony's 50th Anniversary Season—that phrase has resonated with me in profound ways. What exactly is the music of the Ocala Symphony?

When I think about our music, I envision bold, exciting programs. I think of the great masters of the past standing shoulder-to-shoulder with the trailblazers of the present.

I imagine a special emphasis on celebrating American works and music from our art's history that has been regrettably overlooked. Our incredible audience has come to expect performances of beloved works delivered at the highest level, while also being challenged and delighted by lesser-known masterpieces that leave them wondering why they haven't heard them before. Our dedicated musicians bring an infectious passion to rehearsals, diving into masterworks and pops repertoire with equal intensity and continually raising the bar with each performance. As Music Director and programmer, I am driven to uncover more—more depth in pieces we think we know, more hidden gems from composers both celebrated and overlooked, and more ways to connect with our community. These unique pursuits are the inspired hallmarks that make the Ocala Symphony truly special.

With this in mind, planning our 50th Anniversary Season was both a joy and a responsibility. After much research, listening, and reflection, each piece I've programmed was thoughtfully chosen and has deliberate meaning. This milestone season reflects the heart of "Your Orchestra, Your Music." It features repertoire that will absolutely thrill and delight, world-class soloists joining us from home and abroad, and a collective program that surpasses anything we've done before. The 2025-26 season is not only a celebration of our first 50 years but a bold statement that—with your continued support—your orchestra will be playing your music for the next 50 years and beyond.

We are deeply grateful for your support, and I cannot wait to see you this season. Thank you for being an integral part of this extraordinary journey. Let's make music together!

Matthew Wardell is a conductor known for his endearing music making in both pops and classical settings, his precision in live-to-film conducting, and the use of his quick wit to bring joy and presence to any audience. He has publicly performed more than 490 works in over 300 live performances. In addition to being the music director of the Ocala Symphony he also currently serves as the Director of Orchestral Studies at the University of South Florida and has held previous visiting artist positions throughout the United States. In 2024, Wardell was named the first prize winner in the professional division of the American Prize's Vytautas Marijosius Memorial Award in Orchestral Programming. Recent guest conducting appearances include leading the Jacksonville Symphony (Disney's Star Wars: A New Hope in Concert), the Florida Orchestra, Chamber Orchestra of Pittsburgh, the Southwest Florida Symphony Orchestra, the New England Philharmonic, the Gainesville Orchestra, and the Pioneer Valley Symphony Orchestra.

The Reilly Arts Center Is Ocala's home for live entertainment and the home of the Ocala Symphony Orchestra.

The OSO was formed in 1975 and launched a capital fundraising campaign in 2013 to renovate the historic City Auditorium into what is now the Reilly Arts Center which opened in October 2015. The Reilly hosts more than 165 concerts and events annually, that range from the OSO to Grammy-Award winning musicians and community events. In 2022, the Reilly expanded to include the NOMA Black Box Theatre and the Ocala Symphony Community Music Conservatory. In 2021, the Reilly Arts Center group took over management of the historic Marion Theatre in downtown Ocala, presenting films and live performances for the community and guests to enjoy.
